



# 1890 Collaborative

### North Carolina A&T State University

This project will leverage strengths of the 1890 Land Grant Universities (LGU) system to prepare youth



in middle and high school with leadership skills necessary for agricultural-related careers. The major outcome will be an enhanced system of outreach for 4-H Positive Youth Development (PYD) programs that reaches all youth.

The 1890 YEA Collaborative is a project led by North Carolina Agricultural and Technical State University that spans six states in partnership with Alcorn State University, Fort Valley State

University, Kentucky State University, Lincoln University, and Prairie View A&M University. Together, they are working to develop programs that make college more accessible, and aims to provide the youth with the necessary leadership skills for agricultural-related careers. It includes a youth mentorship program, exposure to college campuses, increased accessibility to college, and youth engagement through 4H programs.

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# Juntos YEA: Advancing Agriscience Pathways

North Carolina State University

**Juntos YEA:** Advancing Agriscience Pathways is a transformational, interdisciplinary, collaborative project that will prepare youth to become the next generation of leaders and workforce in STEM and Agriscience.

# Led by NC State, Juntos YEA supports the following:

- A. Implementation of the Juntos Program in five states, while launching the program's fifth component: Career Pathways | Caminos A Carreras (CaC).
- B. Establish the National Juntos Consortium (NJC)

This project also launched the **National Juntos Consortium (NJC).** The consortium, comprising six universities, promotes program fidelity, scalability, cooperation, and professional development among Extension professionals to strengthen and sustain the Juntos Program.

The mission of the Juntos program is to help students and their families gain knowledge, skills, and resources to ensure high school graduation and broaden post-secondary academic and career opportunities. Juntos YEA Career Pathway component provides students with the opportunity to learn about various careers

in agriculture and offers various benefits:

- 1. Career Exploration
- 2. Guidance and Support
- 3. Mentorship Connections
- 4. Internship Opportunities
- 5. Skills Development
- 6. Confidence Building
- 7. Networking

This project expands Juntos' impact beyond North Carolina, focusing on workforce development and building partnerships with industry and community leaders to support scalability and sustainability.








# Empowering the Next Generation Ag & Food Systems Workforce

Together, they are undertaking a research project to engage youth and adults to increase their understanding of career and employment pathways in agriculture and food systems. 

This project will produce future leaders and advocates of food production and healthy living regionally, nationally, and internationally. The research data will inform Extension and other youth development professionals how better to include all youth and adults. The University of Maine, in partnership

with Somali Bantu Community

Association, Khmer Maine Cambodian Community and Mano en Mano, and The University of Vermont, in collaboration with SEA (Student Education Assistance) and AALV, provides experiential learning, practical knowledge and life skill development to hundreds of youth.
