

See What I Mean?



Materials

- Paper
- Pencil

Instructions

- One person draws a picture using only basic shapes. A volunteer then describes the picture drawn to everyone else. Without seeing the picture, each person must try to reproduce the picture based solely on what the volunteer is relying on them. The ultimate goal is for them to be able to create the same picture.
- This activity emphasizes how very important verbal communication is, and also how it can be vastly interpreted by different people. To really drive the point home you can do a few rounds of this game. This

would exhibit how some people interpret directions and communication differently from others. It also shows how certain methods are more easily understood than others.

Debrief

- Talk about how we interpret certain sayings
- Talk about tone of voice when talking about some subject matters can significantly improve your relationship with them.
- Once they understand club members' thought patterns, they will be able to better communicate their ideas and collaborate more efficiently.
