Would you like to own a dairy goat? Do you know the different breeds of dairy goats and how to identify them? In this project area, we will be studying dairy goats, their proper care, and benefits of a dairy goat's milk.



Exploring 4-H Dairy Goats Spark Activity: Homemade Goat Cheese

Make Simple Goat Cheese

- 1 Gallon Goat Milk
- 1/2 Cup vinegar or lemon juice
- 2 tsp garlic salt
- 1 TBSP dried sweet basil
- cheesecloth and strainer

Directions:

- 1. Slowly bring milk to boil on stove, stirring constantly
- 2. Once milk starts to froth (little bubbles on spoon) it is close to boiling
- 3. Turn off heat once it reaches a boil
- 4. Gently stir in vinegar. Milk should start to curdle or clump.
- 5. Prepare a strainer or colander with a two layers over a stainless steel bowl
- 6. Slowly pour milk mixture over cheesecloth. This will separate the curds from the whey. Be careful to avoid getting splattered with hot milk mixture!
- Drain off the whey and bundle the curds in the cheesecloth. 7.
- 8. Twist the cheese cloth to squeeze remaining liquid from the cheese curds. Press with a spoon to release more liquid.
- 9. Pour drained curds into a bowl.
- 10. Mix in garlic salt and dried basil.
- 11. Store in a sealed container in the refrigerator.

Extra Tip: You can make your own cheese mold with a tin can or a coffee mug. Line the can or mug with waxed paper. Alternately add curds to the mold and press down with a smaller can or glass to form cheese into a 'log' shape. Remove by lifting out with waxed paper.

- Make soap products out of your dairy goat's milk

- Look into permits and guidelines for selling raw milk and cheese

- Find dairy goat live cams! There are many "live feed" cameras that focus on dairy goats and their behavior. They can show anything from baby goats playing, the birthing process, or proper care.
