Exploring Costume DesignSpark Activity: Design a Character Costume

SUPPLIES:

- Paper
- Crayons, markers or colored pencils

DIRECTIONS:

Design a costume for a character from your favorite book, show, or film.

- Choose a character you like from a book, tv show or film.
- On a piece of paper, brainstorm what you know about the character. Where do they live? What do they do? What is their personality like?
- Choose a setting to place your character in (like a forest, a city, or a school).
- Brainstorm what that setting is like. Is it warm or cold? Is it dull or colorful?
- With your character and setting in mind, choose the colors you will use for your character's costume.
- With your setting in mind, sketch a rendering of a costume for your character using colored pencils, markers, or crayons.
- Share your sketch with friends and family!

- · Create your own patterns
- Explore advanced sewing and construction techniques
- Learn about careers in costume design
