## 4-H Black History Month 30 Days Challenge

Every February, people in the United States celebrate the history and the achievements of African Americans as a part of Black History Month.

Are you ready to take the challenge and complete a Black History Month activity each day in February in this state-level Experience awards-eligible activity?

## 30 days challenge

- 1. Writing Prompt: What does Black History Month mean to you?
- 2. Writing Prompt: What is a hero to you? Name 3 heroes in Black history
- 3. Activity: Visit an important location in Black history, virtually (Google Earth, YouTube, Documentary etc.) or locally
- 4. Activity: Read a book by a Black author (click for recommendations)
- 5. Activity: Make a playlist of 5 inspiring songs by Black musicians
- 6. Writing Prompt: Name one Black historical figure and describe how they have affected our lives today
- 7. Activity: What is "Blues Dancing"? When and where did it originate? Learn at least 1 Blues dance
- 8. **Activity:** Pick any person that has contributed to Black history and make a 5-song playlist that describes them
- 9. Quiz: What is Juneteenth and why is it important?
- 10. **Activity**: Support a local Black-owned business by researching businesses in your area and visiting or sharing about them with your friends.
- 11. **Activity:** What is Soul food? Make a dish using a recipe. Visit your local library for resources!
- 12. Quiz: What is an HBCU? How many are there?
- 13. Live Activity: Host a Black History Month trivia night with your club, family, or friend group!
- 14. Activity: Watch a Black history movie. Ask your local library for ideas!
- 15. Writing Prompt: What was Dr. Martin Luther King Jr.'s march on Washington?
- 16. **Activity:** Create a Black History Month poster or sign and use it to decorate your space.
- 17. Writing Prompt: Pick a Black Entrepreneur and describe their contributions
- 18. Writing Prompt: Pick a Black Inventor and describe their contributions

- 19. Learn: Write a timeline of the Rosa Parks Boycott. Ask your local library for resources.
- 20. Writing Prompt: "Do the best you can until you know better. Then, when you know better, do better." Who said this quote, and what are they known for?
- 21. **Explore:** Take a virtual tour. Try one of the linked tours here: <u>Columbias AA heritage</u> sites, <u>Schaumburg Center for Research and Black Culture</u>
- 22. Writing Prompt: What is the NAACP? What do they do? When was it founded?
- 23. Quiz: Who created Black History Month & why?
- 24. **Activity:** Watch a movie by a Black director. Ask your local library for recommendations!
- 25. Explore: Click the link to learn more about the Ida B Wells House: Chicago
- 26. Activity: Listen to a podcast featuring curated Black History content
- 27. Quiz: What Supreme court trial gave rights to Black Americans?
- 28. Activity: Write a song or poem about a Black historical figure
- 29. Quiz: What is Hip-hop? When and where was it founded? Name 3 Hip-Hop artists
